About this Pre-Conference: The 2019 Peer Relationships Pre-Conference aims to bring together scholars across disciplines to highlight new advances in scientific research on peer relationships from childhood through adolescence. This year's pre-conference will focus on several major topics, including: (a) scientifically solid procedures for planning, analyzing and sharing peer-based research, (b) urgent social, cultural, and political issues rising to the forefront of peer research, and (c) the relevance of peer research for intervention and policy efforts. During the pre-conference there will be several plenary talks, multiple breakout discussion sessions, a poster session, and networking opportunities throughout the day.

About this Pre-Conference: This pre-conference convenes the community of scholars interested in the nature and function of religion and spirituality in child and adolescent development. The pre-conference is designed to engage attendees in discussions on the theoretical and empirical examination of religion and spirituality and to highlight cutting-edge research in these areas. We explore how to conceptualize and operationalize religion as a context in which human development occurs; and we seek to delineate the mechanisms through which spirituality and religious cognitions and beliefs develop. As such, this pre-conference will encourage scholars to consider how religious and spiritual development can inform traditional assumptions and approaches to understanding developmental processes, both for established scholars in this area of work and for scholars interested in engaging in these discussions for the first time. The organizers built the program to incorporate diversity in the religious beliefs and cultural systems represented and discussed. In addition, a broad scope of human development

is considered, with scholars examining interacting domains of development (socioemotional, cognitive, psychopathology) and varying domains of religious and spiritual development (concepts, cognitive processes, moral development, character development, identity, parenting).

The theme of the 2019 Pre-Conference will be **Cognitive & Affective Components of Religious & Spiritual Beliefs**. Presentations and discussions will consider questions such as:

- What do children and adolescents at different developmental points mean when they say they ‘believe’ in religious agents and practices? How do cognitive and emotional processes interact in developmental shifts in the certainty of belief in religious agents and practices?
- To what extent does belief in religious agents and practices play a role in moral development and identity formation?
- How are socialization practices (e.g., parenting, rituals, religious instruction) related to belief religious agents and practices?
- How do transcendent and spiritual experiences contribute to belief in religious agents and practices, and what do those look like over development? How do transcendent and spiritual experiences effect meaning, identity, commitments? How do such experiences direct the development of one’s personal narrative?

In addition to a keynote speaker, the pre-conference will feature a variety of formats, including round-table discussions, poster presentations, and research talks in order to foster discussion, build research networks, and connect younger and more established scholars to each other.

Thanks to generous donations from The John Templeton Foundation and the Thrive Center at Fuller Theological Seminary, this pre-conference is FREE for attendees. To encourage networking and discussion, attendees receive a breakfast, lunch and other refreshments throughout the day. SRCD attendees whose work addresses any of the above topics or who simply wish to learn more about religious and spiritual development are invited to attend.

About this Pre-Conference: Language acquisition is a crucial childhood accomplishment as it influences school readiness and achievement, self-regulation, and life and health outcomes. Yet, any number of factors can interfere with a child’s ability to become an effective communicator—and one of these factors may be growing up in poverty. This pre-conference will bring together interdisciplinary scholars to discuss a) recent challenges to the existence of a “word gap” associated with poverty and b) the importance of addressing the word gap through interventions). By now there are numerous, promising interventions that promote enriched language experiences -- especially for children in poverty. Talking with children starting at birth is key for the promotion of language growth – at home, in child care, and in school. For this pre-conference poster symposium, invited early childhood experts from diverse fields (e.g., developmental psychology, early intervention, pediatrics, public health, nursing, speech and language pathology, early education, children’s media, technology innovations for instruction, and public policy) will present posters with empirical evidence describing the existence and nature of the language gap and interventions studies that have demonstrated success in promoting early communication and reducing the “word gap”. Panel discussions will identify the highlights of the posters and evoke discussion of the implications of the studies for policy, practice, and the next generation of research on these topics.
