

# Statement from SRCD President Vonnie C. McLoyd and Executive Director Saima Hedrick on the Shootings at The Covenant School in Nashville, Tennessee

Our nation once again must grapple with the news that a shooter has taken the lives of innocent people – this time three innocent nine-year-old children and three adults at The Covenant School in Nashville, Tennessee.

According to [CNN](#), this event marks “the 19th shooting at a school or university so far in 2023 that left at least one person wounded.” We must do better to protect our communities and to keep our children safe.
