Her publications cover topics of ethnic-racialized identity, discrimination, family and school ethnic-racial socialization, and the well-being of adolescents and young adults. She has co-chaired the SRCD International Committee, is a member of the SRCD Asian Caucus, and is a past member of the Executive Council of the Society for Research on Adolescence. She has a B.A. degree in Child Development from the University of Minnesota and M.A. and Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology from Michigan State University.

"Dr. Juang is an outstanding scholar with extensive editorial experience. *Child Development Perspectives* will be well-served by her vision to increase the journal's international perspectives, while maintaining its status as a leading journal for high-quality, well-synthesized reviews of research and innovative conceptual work pertaining to pressing topics," said Dr. Vonnie McLoyd, SRCD Governing Council President.
