Call for Nominations: 2019 Alan T. Waterman Award

The Social, Behavioral, and Economic division of the National Science Foundation has announced a call for nominations for the 2019 Alan T. Waterman Award. The annual award recognizes an outstanding young researcher in any field of science or engineering supported by the National Science Foundation. In addition to a medal, the awardee receives a grant of \$1,000,000 over a five-year period for scientific research or advanced study in the mathematical, physical, biological, engineering, social or other sciences at the institution of the recipient's choice. Candidates must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, 40 years of age or younger, *or* no more than 10 years beyond receipt of their Ph.D. degrees by December 31 of the year in which they are nominated. We are especially interested in nominations for women, members of underrepresented groups in science and engineering, and person with disabilities. The 2018 Waterman awardee, Dr. Kristina Olson, is an SBE-supported investigator.
